Summer vacations: a "drug" against crisis?

What will be the impact of the crisis on Europeans and Americans' summer vacations?

A Harris Interactive exclusive poll, in partnership with France 24 and the International **Herald Tribune**

The latest Harris Interactive / FRANCE 24 / International Herald Tribune poll finds that even if the economic situation won't strongly impact summer vacation plans, the crisis will affect people's frame of mind.

Europeans and Americans don't intend to give up their vacation plans even if some of them are thinking of reducing their budgets when compared to last year.

But, this year vacations will not take place in a totally serene climate, as the crisis and its economic consequences will stay in their minds.

Most of Europeans and Americans think that, because of the crisis, the leaders who govern us should go on vacation for fewer days, or even cancel their vacation plans!

Results to be released on June, 26th 2009 on FRANCE 24's «Paris Live Business» and published in the International Herald Tribune on June, 26th 2009.

Methodology

The latest poll was conducted online by Harris Interactive, in partnership with FRANCE 24 and The International Herald Tribune, among a total of 6,304 adults (aged 16-64) within France, Germany, Great Britain, Spain and the United-States; and adults (aged 18-64) in Italy, from 27th may to 1st june 2009. The data were weighted, where necessary, by age, gender, education, region and Internet usage to make it representative of the general population profile for each country. Propensity score weighting was applied to adjust for respondents' propensity to be online.

The poll explores a number of issues, including:

- The impact of the economic crisis on this summer's vacation
- The frame of mind in which these summer vacations will take place
- The number of vacation days planned for this summer
- The attitude that our leaders should adopt for their own summer vacation plans

Please note that any communication of these results has to be made with technical elements such as: survey methodology, fieldwork dates, name of the agency, sample size



THE IMPACT OF THE ECONOMIC CRISIS ON THIS SUMMER'S VACATION

In spite of the strong worries of the populations because of the economic crisis, few Europeans and Americans will give up their vacation this summer.

People are split into 3 main groups:

- Those who did not plan to go on vacation. This is highest in Spain (31%) and the U.S (30%).
- Those for who the crisis won't have any impact on their usual summer vacation. This is highest in Germany (45%), Great Britain (33%), France (31%) and Italy (25%)
- Those who will adjust their vacation plans to face the crisis
 - o 7% overall will cancel their summer vacation. The French are most likely to cancel (12%) while the Germans are least likely (1%).
 - o 15% overall will reduce their vacation budget, especially Spaniards (24%)
 - o 9% in the 6 countries will go away for a shorter period, with Italians (14%) and Americans (12%) most likely to say this.

THE FRAME OF MIND IN WHICH THESE SUMMER VACATIONS WILL TAKE PLACE

Since so few people are cancelling their vacations, one reason may be that they are a necessary break and help people forget their daily worries.

Thus, half of British (55%), French (51%) and Spanish (51%) adults will be forgetting, while three in five Italians (62%) and Germans (58%) as well as over half of Americans (54%) will be bringing the troubles with them.

While between one-quarter and over one-third of Europeans and two in five Americans say the economic crisis will spoil their vacations, majorities in each of the countries say the crisis won't spoil their time away.

NUMBER OF VACATION DAYS PLANED THIS SUMMER

In average¹ Europeans and Americans will go away this summer for less than 10 days versus more than 11 days last summer. This decrease is obvious in each of the 6 surveyed countries, and large numbers of people are less likely to take vacations of more than 2 weeks (22% on average vs. 31% in 2008).

This summer as last summer, Americans are take the least number of days for vacations (on average 6 days this summer vs. 7 days last summer).

And the Spaniards are the ones who take the highest number of days for vacation (on average 14 days this summer vs. 17 last summer).

THE ATTITUDE THAT OUR LEADERS SHOULD ADOPT FOR THEIR OWN SUMMER VACATION PLANS

Looking at this economic situation, Europeans and Americans express very strong feelings regarding their leaders' vacations: one third of adults in the six countries believe the leaders who govern them should go on vacation for fewer days than normal and almost one third think that they should cancel their plans to go on vacation!
